Each year, many West Texans wonder if they should get the flu vaccine. I believe it is in the best interest of most patients. However, there are those who advocate against it, and they site concern for the ingredients of the flu shot. In addition, there are side affects, adverse reactions, and contraindications to the flu vaccine to consider. I believe, in most cases, the pros outweigh the cons.

Influenza, the "Flu", is an acute respiratory illness caused by Influenza A or B viruses. The typical flu season ranges from October through March of each year. People become infected with the flu when they come into close contact with a person infected with the flu virus. The flu is transmitted by respiratory secretions of those infected individuals. These secretions can be aerosolized and transmitted through sneezing and coughing. Transmission can also occur by coming in contact with secretions on surfaces, then trans locating those secretions to the eye, nose or mouth. Typical symptoms of the flu are fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, muscle aches, and headache.

Complications with the flu can be very serious. The most common complication is pneumonia. However, the muscle and central nervous system can be affected as well. Ultimately, infection with the flu virus can even lead to death and in some cases cause massive death rates. One of the best examples of this is the 1918 Influenza pandemic.

The flu vaccine has been recommended by the United States Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, Centers for Disease Control (CDC), World Health Organization (WHO), along with many other health experts. In the United States, two types of Influenza vaccines are available. Inactivated (dead) "the shot" Influenza vaccines and a live-attenuated influenza (weakened) nasal spray vaccine.

In conclusion, I believe it is important to monitor and keep up with the most current research and recommendations by health experts and organizations. It is also important for you to speak to your health provider to see if the flu vaccine is right for you. The CDC and WHO work together to bring us the best vaccines through a scientific approach; however, there are many influenza viruses which can mutate or change making it very difficult to manage. Considering the pros and cons, I feel it is best for most patients to get the flu vaccine after speaking with their health care provider.
