HEAT STROKE

Dog days of summer are at our door step. It's important to remember good sun block, insect repellent, along with other typical protective devices. In this part of the world people work hard long days exposed to extreme heat. This combination can lead to heat stroke also known as sunstroke. Heat stroke is when a persons body gets too hot 104 degrees or higher. Heat stoke is the most serious condition of elevated body temperature and occurs from a progression from heat related illnesses such as heat cramps, heat fainting, and heat exhaustion. It's a medical emergency that needs to be treated quickly, if you suspect anyone with heat stroke call 911 and attempt to cool the person down. Signs and symptoms include headaches, muscle cramps, vomiting or diarrhea, skin redness, fast breathing, rapid heartbeat, muscle cramps, trouble walking, hallucinating, seizures, confusion and passing out. Preventative measures you can take to avoid heat stroke is work or exercise early in the day before it gets too hot, take breaks, avoid being too active, drink plenty of fluids such as water or sports drinks, wear loose, light-weight clothes, spray yourself with cool water. People with many health conditions, the elderly, and young athletes are more likely to develop heat stroke. Good common sense goes a long ways when temperatures rise. Avoid long heat exposers if possible, be aware of signs and symptoms and drink plenty of fluids and most importantly stay COOL.
